Sermon Series ~ September 8- September 29 Through many months of prayer, congregational conversations, and discernment, we have completed the strategic plan that will guide Highland for the next 3-5 years. We heard common themes about what has kept you at Highland and we also heard common dreams too. Much of those dreams revolve around Highland being a spiritual home where we can deepen our individual and collective faith as we walk together on the path to being seen, known, and loved. This sermon series will dive into the strategic plan and reflect on how we are being called to participate in God's mission in the world. Our vision centers around being "seen, known, and loved," so we will look at some of Jesus' most famous encounters where he shows us very clearly how to live out that vision. We will start the series with a sermon on "The Road to Emmaus." After that, we will consider Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well and Nicodemus. We'll also reflect on one of Jesus' most famous parables, "The Good Samaritan." I can't wait to unveil our strategic plan through these wonderful stories. My hope is that they will inspire us to live into this plan and all the wonderful God-sized dreams we have for Highland.



MISSION & OUTREACH CORNER

You will most likely recognize the name of Sahar, whom Highland resettled from Afghanistan to the United States in



2021. Sahar's father is a doctor who works with the World Health Organization. While vaccinating children against polio recently, he was kidnapped by the Taliban. They threatened his life and accused of being an American spy. They interrogated and tortured him, intending to demand a ransom

for his release. After six terrifying days, he was released with the expectation that he would get funds for them. He and his family fled from their home.

In partnership with Church World Services, the Highland Resettlement Initiative has recruited a support team for Sahar's family. They are raising money to bring Sahar's family to safety. You have been encouraged to contribute to the public fundraiser to support the resettlement of Sahar's family. This week, the Session of Highland Presbyterian Church approved an official Highland fundraiser to further

support this effort. There are so many desperately tragic situations around the world about which we fear we can do nothing. But this is an opportunity to respond to Christ's call to care for our neighbors and to make a tangible difference in the lives of Sahar and her family. Put Your Caring Gifts to Use to Connect with Others! Parish Visitors are caring professionals who reach out and support care receivers of all types, offering active listening, care, prayer and support. Each parish visitor decides on the kind of support they choose to offer and are then matched with members and guests who need this type of support. Frequent contact occurs through phone calls, cards, emails, and visits where appropriate given the constraints of residents' locations. This year Parish Visitors have attended memorial services, graveside services, taken their care receivers to lunch or dinner after church, and stayed in touch as is appropriate for each Parish Visitor and the people they are visiting. Some have delivered food when needed, but all the Parish Visitors continue to support their individuals. Pastor Ann offers a one-hour periodic training for men and women to serve as Parish Visitors.

Hospital Visitors visit members in local hospitals and rehab centers helping to support regular Ministers' visits. After training, volunteers determine which weekday they want to visit and receive assignments and locations from Pastor Ann. Volunteers are also needed to visit hospice and skilled care centers or work as teams to assure that Highland's members and guests receive frequent visits. In addition, Deacons visit on Sundays, taking flowers from the service to hospitalized congregants. Ministers and Parish Associates also make regular visits with hospitalized congregants, also visiting rehab, personal care, and retirement center locations. More hospital visitors are needed, and Pastor Ann is scheduling a training event in mid-October.

Health and Hope (Project Goal) This ministry supports educational events, networking and resources for families dealing with the effects of a family member dealing with addiction, and to recruit speakers to provide training to Highland's members. The ministry is instrumental in supporting a 'closed AA Group for Women' at Highland and is helping to network individuals and families dealing with the diseases of addition with support resources, and assistance. More Volunteers are needed to continue this ministry. Health and Hope Ministry Goals for 2024-25 include providing more congregational opportunities for education and referral, online educational events and expanding awareness of this valuable ministry to new Highland volunteers and members.
