Sermon Series ~ September 8- September 29 Through many months of prayer, congregational conversations, and discernment, we have completed the strategic plan that will guide Highland for the next 3-5 years. We heard common themes about what has kept you at Highland and we also heard common dreams too. Much of those dreams revolve around Highland being a spiritual home where we can deepen our individual and collective faith as we walk together on the path to being *seen*, *known*, *and loved*. Food items are placed on the Food Cupboard located beside the doors to Fellowship Hall and delivered by church volunteers to the Lancaster County Food Hub. During Advent a special Advent Food Calendar is produced which lists suggested food donations for each day of Advent. In 2023 over 1200 pounds of food were donated by the Highland congregation.
