From Your Stewardship Committee: Giving Through Your IRA. After you turn 70-1/2 years of age, federal tax laws permit giving up to \$100,000 per year to charities from an individual retirement or similar plan through qualified charitable distributions. These contributions do not count as charitable tax deductions, but instead are not treated as taxable income. They also count toward reducing any required minimum distributions to which you may be subject (where the age requirements may vary).

Most IRA plan websites give additional details and explain the mechanics involved. Please consider joining many other Highland members in giving in this way.

The Earth Care Committee Join us after today's worship for a walk around Highland's grounds to talk about the Green Master Plan that was developed by Land Studies for the Earth Care committee.
