Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) "Gifts of the Heart" Clean-up Buckets

As our neighbors suffer the effects of not one but now two major hurricanes, the PC(USA) is responding. Presbyteries and churches from around the country are coming together to create clean-up buckets (called "Gifts of the Heart"). If you are looking for a tangible way to support neighbors devastated by these hurricanes, consider putting together one or more of these clean-up buckets. Highland is going to act as a collection point for this region of Donegal Presbytery. We will be collecting buckets until October 16th, after which they will be transported south. You can find a needs-list below. Please drop your buckets off at the reception desk in the office.

Let us join churches around the country to bring compassion in a bucket, and support our neighbors!

Cleanup Bucket

- One five-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid. Advertisement on the outside acceptable.)
- · One 4-8oz. pump spray air freshener
- · Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- · Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (with or without handle.)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose dry-cleaning towels (No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels. Remove from packaging.)
- One 32-64oz. or two 25oz. bottle (s) of liquid laundry detergent
- · One 16-34oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-40oz. bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- One package of 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line.)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; no surgical masks.)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple use. Remove from packaging.)
- One pair of work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather)
- · 20-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (remove from packaging)
- One 6-9oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent (Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes also acceptable.)

VALUE: About \$75

A Note for the Buckets - All cleaning items must be new, and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket. Please do not enclose cash or checks inside of the kits or boxes.

We've offered scholarships for up to 50 elementary aged children (kindergarten through sixth grade). This is crucial for the children of El Limon, a poor neighborhood where many families could not afford the



modest tuition for this private school. Recently high school students (grades 10 – 12) have also joined the school. Our partners in IRCES want to fill the gap, offering junior high (grades 7-9) too. But to do that they need more classrooms. To build and equip those classrooms, they need our help. This October, Highland will be receiving donations to support the Juan Calvino school's building plans.
