
you wait for the Christ Child and prepare your heart to welcome Him this Christmas. Copies of these booklets will be in the narthex starting today, December 1.

You may bring the food items each Sunday and put them in the collection boxes in the Narthex and in the office area or you can fill a box and bring it in on Christmas Eve. All food collected will be taken to the Lancaster Food Hub. The Lancaster Food Hub provides food, clothing, and outreach services to those deeply affected by poverty as well as the working poor.
